On October 18, 19, & 20, the Ballet Theatre of Maryland opens its 41st Season at the newly christened Michael E. Busch Center for the Performing Arts at Maryland Hall in Annapolis with **the creation of another new premiere ballet**—*The Snow Queen*. Based on the famous Hans Christian Anderson fairytale, which is also the inspiration for Disney's blockbuster *Frozen*, *The Snow Queen* explores the icy cold aspects of our shadow selves and teaches us how to embrace them through the power of love and friendship in order to find healing and redemption.

The story begins with some evil mischief stirred up by the Frost Goblin King (Alexander Collen) who uses his scrying bowl to search the earth for the perfect candidate to become his Snow Queen With snow and ice, he will be able to rule the world. Gerda and Kai are the Tutor's children and have been trained to serve as her Royal Protectors since they were born. The Goblin King is elated, because Aleksia's magic and sorrow will allow him to claim her with one of his darkened crystal shards. But he does not anticipate the power of Gerda and Kai's love and friendship for Aleksia as they set off on an epic journey to free her and the kingdom from the icy powers that have trapped everyone in an eternal blanket of winter. Mysterious trolls, an Enchantress, gypsies, fairies, magic, and humor combine to help Gerda and Kai battle the elements in a race to save the kingdom and liberate those they love from their deepest, darkest fears.

The performance on Friday, October 18, includes a Meet and Greet the Dancers immediately following the performance in the theater. On Saturday, October the 19th, you can purchase tickets to BTM's 41st Anniversary Grande Opening VIP Reception from 5:00 to 7:00, which includes a light buffet, wine, a raffle, a paddle raise, and an opportunity to talk to the dancers and choreographer about the ballet, their passions, and their lives. The performance follows this event. Tickets may be purchased as a package or separately. On Sunday, October 19th, you can attend the Ice Palace Tea Party one hour prior to the performance-free, with your Matinee Performance ticket.
