
CASEY CARES



The Dancer's Journey: Becoming a Professional Dancer

The path to becoming a professional varies greatly from one dancer to another, but it involves natural talent as well as years of coordinated effort and study. Some dancers, such as company principal Victoria Siracusa, make the transition from student to professional by entering a trainee program associated with a professional company. Others, like company apprentice Lauren Anderson, balance their desire for an academic degree and a professional career by going to college for dance. No matter what path a dancer takes, their desired destination is the same. It's up to the individual dancer and their parents to decide the best way to get there. Here's what Victoria has to say:

"From a very young age, I knew I wanted to be a ballet dancer. My journey leading up to my professional years at BTM has not been the easiest, but the highs and lows have played a significant role in shaping my passion for ballet and the person I am today. I started dancing at the age of 3, and I bounced between recital schools before joining a ballet training school around the age of 9. I was pushed past my limits and constantly ridiculed, and it was not a healthy environment for someone my age. It wasn't until I was in high school that I broke free from this influence and I realized that there was so much more beyond these destructive ideas. I joined the Hartt School Community Division and trained under Samantha Dunster and Susannah Marchese.

"After I graduated high school I auditioned at various places and was thrilled to receive a full trainee scholarship to Charlottesville Ballet in Virginia, marking my first company experience. I am grateful for my experiences there, but at 18, I felt something was missing in my dancing and I was eager for new challenges somewhere else. I moved to Sarasota to train with The Margaret Barbieri Conservatory in Sarasota during the summer of 2016. After I arrived, I was informed that the director did not want me to be part of the Conservatory because I didn't look like the other dancers in the Conservatory or the company. This news crushed my dreams. I found myself in a difficult situation—having moved to Sarasota and now without a job lined up, I wasn't sure what to do next."



On September 14, 1975, Elizabeth Ann Seton (1774-1821) became the first person born in the United States to be canonized as a Saint in the Catholic Church. This ballet was created to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of her Sainthood. A prominent historical figure, she has been inducted into both the Maryland and the National Women's Hall of Fame.

Born on the Eve of the American Revolution, Elizabeth Ann Seton established the US Chapter of the Sisters of Charity in Emmitsburg, Maryland and their legacy has been farreaching throughout the country and internationally. Mother Seton's many passions included a love of dancing, which gives the creation of this ballet an added significance.

A Saint's presence offers healing to those whom they encounter. This one-act ballet depicts Mother Seton tending to a young woman, Fanny Cornforth, who has been betrayed and heartbroken. Mother Seton offers her own story as a self-sufficient young woman, who fell deeply in love, only to devastatingly lose her husband to tuberculosis leaving her a widow at age 29 with five children. Despite a difficult road ahead of her, filled with many challenges and the further loss of loved ones to illness, she was upheld by her faith, projecting a spirit of peace and radiant joy that lifted those who experienced her.

Stylistically this choreography was inspired by the artistic legacy of the Rossetti family, especially Dante Gabriel Rossetti and his painting Found. While there were women who encountered Mother Seton, as depicted in this ballet, the real Fanny Cornforth was an art model who did not meet her; nonetheless, in paying homage to both the historical and artistic legacies, I preserved the name of the model while depicting the shared experiences of other women.
